

Global Consultation on the International Recommendations on Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) Statistics (IRIS).

Dear Colleague.

Please be informed that the 51<sup>st</sup> session of the UN Statistical Commission will take place from 6 to 9 March 2020 in New York. The agenda of the forthcoming Commission session will include a discussion on Forced displacement statistics, entailing both statistics on refugees and IDPs.

You may recall that, as per the Statistical Commission decision 47/111 of 2016, based on a proposal from Statistics Norway, the Turkish Statistical Institute, Eurostat and UNHCR, an expert group to develop international recommendations on refugee statistics, including internally displaced persons in its scope of work, was formed. In March 2018 the expert group submitted International Recommendations on Refugee Statistics (IRRS) and a Technical Report on IDP Statistics to the Commission, which were approved by the Commission. By the Commission's decision 11/2016 and 115/2018 the group's mandate was expanded and the group was asked to develop International Recommendations on IDP Statistics (IRIS) and a compilers' manual that would provide technical guidance in the implementation of both sets of recommendations, recognizing the differences in the experiences of displacement: refugees have crossed international borders, while IDPs being displaced within the borders of their country of residence. The same decision requested the expert group to conduct a global consultation on the draft recommendations and solicit comments widely prior to the submission to the Commission in 2020.

I am writing this to facilitate the global consultation, by sending you the draft International Recommendations on IDP Statistics (IRIS) submitted by the expert group. same document can be also found at the following http://ec.europa.eu/eurostat/web/expert-group-on-refugee-statistics/documentspresentations/global-consultation.
